DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

1. Worship often gets narrowly defined as the music we sing at church.
What is the danger in having such a small view of worship? What is missing or lost?
2. Although worship is a daily individual practice, there is something unique about worship as a community.
In what ways does a church service feed your soul that you can't experience on your own?
3. Colossians 3:1-17 says "Whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus."
What are some practical ways you put this into practice in your daily life?
4. The Message translation of Rom. 12:1 says, "...Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering." In what practical ways have you taken your everyday, ordinary life and placed it before God as an offering?
5. Part of worship is rebellion or revolt. We see it in Romans 12:2 where Paul says, "Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God." In what ways are you revolting against the current culture as an act of worship? (avoid statements with political undertones)
6. What practical tools (books, calendar, apps, mentors, groups) do you use to help you make a worship a daily experience?
